## **Summary of work during September 2025**

## 1. Achumawi DB

I persist with the work despite interruptions of various kinds, some related to redirecting the proposal process, the most recent being a phishing attack on my wife's computer which has required me to change many passwords on my accounts as well as hers, and to factory-reset my phone. I am also preparing for travel to The Netherlands 5-13 October for a conference. leaving in two days.

I have made significant progress on Chapter 1 of the grammar, but the draft is not yet ready to share. Chapter 1 is about the 'external' syntax of complex sentences. Complex sentences can be made in several ways. The sections of Chapter 1 are:

- 1.1 Conjunction
- 1.2 Anaphoric reference in the second clause, a kind of deixis pointing to something said or implicit in the first clause or in nearby context
- 1.3 Conditional relations translated by English 'if .. then' and the like
- 1.4 Subordinate clause

I will be proceeding to 1.3 and 1.4 soon.

There have been some changes in the database since the last update, but not enough to warrant uploading a current backup file.

Altogether, this is a most disruptive time. To understand what is happening, I find <u>The Fourth Turning is</u> *Here* useful.

## 2. Atsuke DB
